

Patients who request and receive Telemedicine services understand there is no physical examination component of the virtual visit and it is recommend the patient conduct this visit in a private room or office so personal healthcare related issues can be discussed. Vital signs can be recorded into the medical record if provided by the patient. A clinic visit may be recommended if a physical exam is needed to complete the assessment of the condition, or a lab visit to obtain blood samples, or other treatments.

Your physician may allow the annual Medicare wellness screening to be completed by a telemedicine visit and you may be scheduled with a physician assistant. Your physician will oversee a plan recommending appropriate screenings, immunizations, and other preventive services.

Telemedicine visit requirements and recommendations:

- Patients are expected to have a home thermometer.
- Patients are expected to record vital signs on the same day of their appointment.
- Recommended equipment: scale to record weight, blood pressure cuff (digital) to record BP and pulse. Other electronic devices may also used to obtain a pulse (watches or activity tracker devices).

At least one appointment in the office is needed in order to provide optimal health care to our patients. This may be an annual physical exam or a routine office appointment.

All telemedicine services are initiated by the patient who contacts the office requesting a telemedicine appointment. All patients must sign a telemedicine agreement and consent form before this service can be provided.
